Modular Light Fixtures That Go On and On

Endless, the latest fixture from the Brooklyn lighting company Roll & Hill, lives up to its name. Made from modular components, it can be ordered in any length, and configured as a straight or snaking line — potentially one that runs clear across a room. “It’s really a way to define space with light,” said Jason Miller, the company’s chief executive, who designed the piece.

Made with semi-cylindrical pieces of white glass held together by brass brackets, it can be used as a suspension lamp (left), a wall sconce (below left) or some combination of the two. It is an energy-saving LED fixture, but yellow powder-coated plates inside “counteract that purple-y feel,” Mr. Miller said, giving it the warmth of an incandescent light.
